<u>Hornibrook v. Richard</u>, 488 Mass. 74 (2021) (court-appointed conservator was quasi-judicial officer entitled to absolute immunity)

<u>Matter of Olchowski</u>, 485 Mass. 807 (2020) (unidentified funds in attorney's IOLTA account should be transferred to IOLTA committee for disposition)
